The club shield was won by Leicester RYC again because they got a team out to most of the events ensuring they scored good points in each round.

Overall, I am pleased to see that this series still attracts a reasonable level of support amongst the district skippers, but with a little more effort from the club sailor we could improve thing even more thus helping the Watermead and Two Island clubs

achieve a better level of entry for there race. They are after all putting the event on for your benefit.

I also need to remind host clubs that is incumbent on them to provide an OOD who does not sail in the event; this does not mean that you will not get any support far from it. If you need help on the day all you need to do is ask one of the experienced skippers from the district for help to sort out any problem that may arise.
