## 2. Arising from the AGM

### 2017 Sailing and Events Programme

The 2017 District sailing and events programme has now been published on the District web pages. The events have been notified for inclusion in the MYA central calendar.

This year the District will be hosting the first IOM National Ranking Race on 1st and 2nd April. This will be held at Castle Semple under the auspices of Buchanness MYC.

The District programme includes 3 number IOM Travellers events which will be held out with July and August to minimise the impact of disruption due to weed.

The outcome was that the NE and West group finished with the same score, but the Cup was awarded to the West group because one of their skippers had the lowest individual points on the day.
